#### TALAROO / PINNARENDI WEEKEND Report and photos by John Martin











Early July 2024 has finally seen the beginnings of good weather and the NQ Aero Club took advantage of the weather to have a Flying and Camping Weekend to **Talaroo Hot Springs** and **Pinnarendi Station**.

The hot springs are located on Talaroo Station, north west of Mount Surprise. The springs have become the centerpiece of a tourism venture with a café, camping area and boardwalks and swimming pools around the springs.

Six aircraft with 18 people on board headed out from Mareeba and Atherton and landed on the smooth well maintained long grass strip. We were met by a guide and transported the three hundred or so metres to the administration centre and café.

From there we were taken by the guide on a short walk down to the springs.

The springs are well appointed with paths, signage and raised board walks. You are only allowed to go through the area as part of a guided tour but it was well worth the small cost. The guide gave a wide ranging narrative, from the geology and formation of the springs to the local indigenous mythology and then even diversified into local bush tucker and medicinal plants.

The water emerges at 63 degrees from the main vents and then flows through several pools getting cooler at each step. The second pool is set up to allow sitting and putting hands and feet into the 45 degree water and then to a third pool where the water is 35 degrees.

The third pool is a normal swimming pool but with sitting steps all around where guests can sit and soak in the warm water. There are also private above ground pool tanks where people staying in the accommodation can soak.

Use of the main pool is part of the tour but the time is a bit limited.

There are four tours a day but the guide suggested that the 10 am and 2 pm tours are the best for seeing the vents and getting good photos.


After a café style lunch we loaded up the aircraft and headed across to Pinnarendi. Jack Doyle drove out from Mareeba carrying excess camping gear and we set up tents in the busy camp area. We were treated to the usual fantastic pizza dinner by our hosts Ronnie and Nadine.

The morning saw a cold clear sky and we packed up before a hot breakfast in the Pinnarendi café. Then a flight home to round off a great weekend.






