AVIATION MUSEUM OPEN DAY



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The Jabiru guys from Atherton recently did our yearly flying trip, this time heading south.

This year six people in three Jabirus made the "Secret Men's Business" trip which was planned to fly roughly south till we got to the NSW coast south of Sydney then follow the coast around Victoria, past Melbourne and along the Great Ocean Road to Portland then trek north back to Atherton.

Unfortunately, the weather was against us again for the second year in a row. When we got to northern NSW a series of cold fronts coming through from the south-west caused us to rejig the rest of the trip and we turned west.

As is our practice we selected destinations based mostly on the fact that we had not been to them before. We also limit our flying to just 3 or 4 hours per day so we get time to look around when we get there.

The first day was an easy day flying from Atherton to Springsure via charters Towers and Emerald. This was followed by another fairly short second day via Roma to Moree.

The days were clear but cold. The cold caused a bit of trouble starting one of the Jabirus but otherwise was for most of the time, not an issue. After Moree we headed west to Nyngan. It proved an interesting stop though there's not a lot to see or do in Nyngan.

From Nyngan we went to White Cliffs where a few of us had been many years ago. But as the majority hadn't, we headed there to enjoy the hospitality of the underground hotel. After White Cliffs we followed the Darling River south to Menindee then west to Broken Hill.

Broken Hill was worth a look as it had been about twenty years since we had been there. There's quite a lot to see in Broken Hill from mining stuff, to the flying doctor base tour, museums and art galleries. A perennial tourist favourite is to drive 25 km west to Silverton. This is a very small town that was the location of filming of more than twenty five movies and TV series, the most famous being the second of the Mad Max series. There is also an 1880s silver mine with guided tours, both above and below ground. The tour was quite interesting and worth seeing.







We got hit with a day of bad weather on our planned departure day so we spent an extra day in Broken Hill looking at museums and galleries. On the day of our actual departure we had clear blue sky but temperatures so low we had a thick layer of ice on all the wings. That delayed departure till the ice melted off.



After Broken Hill we headed north to Cameron's Corner at the junction of the Queensland, New South Wales and South Australian borders. There's a dirt strip and road house there so it was a good place for lunch. From there it was a short trip to the Burke and Wills Dig Tree at Nappa Merrie on Coopers Creek. While that was an interesting stopover, I managed to get a burr thorn in one tyre which I didn't notice till we got to Innamincka where I then had a flat tyre. The time it took to change and fix the tyre delayed us enough that we abandoned trying to get to Birdsville that day and stayed in Innamincka.





From Innamincka, the next day, we headed off to Windorah for fuel then onward to Longreach. Even though I had been to Longreach Airport multiple times I'd never been into town so we made a point of going in and looking around town.




The following day saw the group split up. My passenger had to return to Cairns to work the following day so we headed north to Hughenden then Atherton. The other guys wanted to catch up with several different friends at Isisford and at a station near Blackall. So they headed south and then having caught up with their friends headed north to arrive home a day later.











Perhaps Thomas could be persuaded to give another presentation at some future date.


